Important points to consider when completing degree plans:

1. The degree plan should include the required number of hours for the degree: 60 for those entering with a master's degree; 72 for those with a bachelor's.
2. Do not include on your plan transfer credits from UNT or other schools that were applied to the requirements of another degree.
3. Even though course schedules may not have been determined for later years, you and your committee should include course numbers and topics that reflect your best guess about future offerings.
4. Be sure to have the correct number and field distribution of faculty members on your committee.
5. Because you may need to make changes to your plan prior to, or even after, approval, please make sure to save a copy for your own records.
6. Do not include any course work on your degree plan after you expect to be ABD.

Failure to have degree plans accepted by the Graduate School in a timely manner, especially if the plan has been returned for any of the above reasons, could impact decisions about student funding.
